RE: Required Redrawing of Commissioner Districts

Based on the results of the 2020 US Census, the Sampson County Board of Commissioners is legally required to redraw the boundaries of the County's five Commissioner districts. The Board held a public hearing on October 18, 2021 in order to receive input from members of the public regarding redistricting. At the public hearing, a draft map was also introduced and discussed by John Morgan, a demographer with Applied Research Coordinates whom the County has engaged to assist the Board with the redistricting process. The Board also indicated at the October 18th public hearing that it would continue to receive public comments in written form through 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 29, 2021.

Staff will provide the Board with a draft resolution approving the proposed Commissioner districts as well as the proposed map prior to the Board's November 1st regular meeting.

BACKGROUND:

The Board previously approved making \$750,000 of ARPA funds available for premium pay for County employees. The County Manager in his budget message indicated that we would like to pay a one-time 2.1 % premium payment to all full-time County employees that were employed as of June 30, 2021. Mr. Clack will review a budget amendment that allocates ARPA funding for eligible employees and County funding for those employees not eligible to be paid from ARPA funds.

RECOMMENDED ACTION OR MOTION:

Approve the proposed budget amendment, approving the use of ARPA funds to pay all eligible full-time employees a 2.1 % premium payment (not expected to exceed \$600,000) and approving the appropriation of up to \$95,000 of County funds for all employees that are not eligible to be paid from ARPA funds

SUBJECT: Premium Pay for Full-Time Employees (American Rescue Plan)

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) makes funds available to make premium pay available to essential workers. While the final rules for eligible costs have not been issued, the interim rule appear to cover at least most of our County personnel.

The Board previously approved making \$750,000 of ARPA funds available for premium pay for County employees. The County Manager in his budget message indicated that we would like to pay a one-time 2.1% premium payment to all full-time County employees that were employed as of June 30, 2021. Any employee that has separated from the County between June 30, 2021 and the date the premium payment is paid will not receive payment.

Based on our review it appears that most of our employees will be eligible to be paid from ARPA funds. The estimated cost is less than \$600,000 in total with approximately \$95,000 that will need to be paid from County funds for those employees that may not be eligible for ARPA funding.

We respectfully recommend that the Board approve the use of ARPA funds to pay all eligible full-time employees a 2.1% premium payment. The total amount is not expected to exceed \$600,000. We further recommend that the Board approve the appropriation of up to \$95,000 of County funds for all employees that are not eligible to be paid from ARPA funds.

The Sampson County Board of Commissioners convened for their regular meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, October 4, 2021 in the County Auditorium, 435 Rowan Road in Clinton, North Carolina. Members present: Chairman Clark Wooten, Vice Chairperson Sue Lee, and Commissioners Thaddeus Godwin, Jerol Kivett, and Lethia Lee.

Chairman Clark Wooten called the meeting to order and acknowledged Vice Chairperson Sue Lee who called upon Commissioner Kivett to provide the invocation. Commissioner Lethia Lee then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Upon a motion made by Commissioner Godwin and seconded by Vice Chairperson Lee, the board voted unanimously to approve the agenda as published.

Item 1: Action Items

Emergency Services – Proposed Five-Year Improvement Plan Emergency Services Director Rick Sauer was present to address any questions regarding his proposed plan, which had been previously provided to the Board and was included in the agenda. There were no comments. Upon a motion made by Vice Chairperson Lee and seconded by Commissioner Godwin, the Board voted unanimously to authorize the hire of six (6) paramedics, with the understanding that an additional new vehicle will be needed as of July, 2022 as part of that squad, and contracting for at least one, possibly two, part-time fire inspectors.

Kivett, the Board voted unanimously to recess to reconvene on October 18, 2021 at 6:00
pm in the County Auditorium.

Clark H. Wooten, Chairman Susan J. Holder, Clerk to the Board

The Sampson County Board of Commissioners reconvened at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, October 18, 2021 in the County Auditorium, 435 Rowan Road in Clinton, North Carolina. Members present: Chairman Clark Wooten, Vice Chairperson Lee, and Commissioners Thaddeus Godwin, Jerol Kivett and Lethia Lee.

Chairman Wooten reconvened the Board. Vice Chairperson Lee provided an invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Item 1: PUBLIC HEARING - REDRAWING OF COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS

Chairman Wooten explained that the purpose of the meeting was to take public comment on the changes that need to be made to the Sampson County Commissioner districts following the 2020 Census results. According to the 2020 Census, the county had a slight population loss overall but some individual commissioner districts within the county gained population while others lost population. Because these gains and losses put some of the commissioner districts more than 5 percent over or under the ideal population for a district, the County is required by law to engage in the redistricting process to better equalize the population of each district. The Chairman thanked the public for attending and explained that while the law does not require the County to hold a public hearing as part of this process, the County wanted to do so because public comments and input are important. The Chairman stated that the County would take the comments and suggestions into consideration as they move forward with adopting a new set of commissioner districts for the county at the next meeting on November 1. The Chairman called upon Assistant County Manager/Clerk to the Board Susan Holder who provided the email and mailing address for submission of written comments.

After thanking those involved with facilitating the hearing, the Chairman introduced Michael McKnight, an attorney with the Ogletree Deakins law firm, and John Morgan, a demographer with Applied Research Coordinates, who had been engaged by the County to assist with the redistricting process. The County worked with Ogletree Deakins and Mr. Morgan during the last round of redistricting after the 2010 Census, so both are familiar with Sampson County and the history of our districts. The Chairman explained that Mr. McKnight and Mr. Morgan have met individually with each of the commissioners to obtain input about the districts, the communities within them, and to discuss the changes that will be required to bring the population of each district in compliance with the law. Based on the input provided by the commissioners, Mr. Morgan developed a draft map to use as a starting point and to illustrate the types of changes that will be required.

The Chairman cautioned that the purpose of the evening's meeting was not to engage in a debate with the commissioners or each other about what the new districts should look like or any other aspect of this process but rather to allow the commissioners to hear directly from any member of the public who wished to speak on this issue. He noted that if there were specific questions about factual issue such as what the Census results showed, where certain lines are on the draft map, or other questions that the commissioners, Mr. Morgan, or Mr. McKnight may be able to answer related to this topic, the Board would do their best to answer those questions.

The Chairman then called upon John Morgan who provided an overview of the proposed new districts, noting the changes from the currently drawn districts necessitated by the changes in population. The Chairman then opened the floor for comments, and there were none. The Chairman then reiterated that the Board would consider adoption of the newly drawn maps at their November 1, 2021 regular meeting and called upon Ms. Holder to repeat the contact information for submission of written comments.

Item 2: UPDATE ON MARKET STUDY FOR PUBLIC SAFETY POSITIONS

County Manager Ed Causey reviewed a revised proposal for evaluating County employee salaries, noting a copy of which had been previously provided to the Board and that if approved by the Board, the proposal would be shared with all department heads to assure clarity and avoid confusion and misunderstanding. Mr. Causey reported that after the Board's previous actions in September, he had had multiple conversations with several Board members who voiced concerns relative to the Sheriff's Office particularly and general departments as well. He explained that Human Resources Director Nancy Dillman had been working on prices for the market study, but that the challenge had been that were numerous studies underway in local governments and many companies were not available to assist the County until late Spring. Given those challenges, staff had considered a revised proposal as follows:

- 1. Complete an internal salary evaluation for all departments. This evaluation will consider only the initial salaries for the entry level of all positions. This effort will not include any reclassifications, time in grade adjustments etc. Staff will then present the Board of Commissioners with specific recommendations. In addition, the final recommendation will seek to resolve any discrepancies between similar grades in the Sheriff's Office and Detention Center created by the recent request to adjust detention center salaries to enhance recruitment.
- 2. Simultaneously, revise/update the original market study request for proposals to cover all departments and thoroughly review all relevant issues, including benefits. Allow work on this request to begin in July, 2022. This will allow potential vendors additional time to complete their existing demands and allocate time for this request.

Knowing that the process would not be complete after the first phase and that the full study could not be done until July, Mr. Causey stressed the need for those with passionate views on process to "hit the pause button" to allow staff to work through the entire process.

Commissioner Kivett moved that the County move forward with the proposal, particularly implementing the first phase as soon as possible, with the expectation that the entire process would move in an expeditious manner. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Godwin and passed unanimously.

WHEREAS, revenue received under the CSLRF must only be spent for purposes authorized by the CSLRF, and applicable regulations, and by state law;

WHEREAS, revenue received under the CSLRF must be accounted for in a separate fund and not comingled with other revenue for accounting purposes; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sampson must comply with all applicable budgeting, accounting, contracting, reporting, and other compliance requirements for CSLRF funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Sampson that we do hereby accept and request CSLRF funding to be distributed by the State of North Carolina; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Sampson affirms that the CSLRF revenue will only be used for the purposes prescribed in the CSLRF, and in US Treasury guidance in 31 CFR, Part 35, and any applicable regulations, and in accordance with state law; and

FUTHER RESOLVED that the County of Sampson will comply with procedures created by the North Carolina General Assembly and the US Treasury Department to receive funds under the act; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Sampson will account for CSLRF in a separate fund and not co-mingle it with other revenues for accounting purposes and will comply with all applicable federal and state budgeting, accounting, contracting, reporting, and other compliance requirements for CSLRF funds; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Sampson designates and directs the County Manager to take all actions necessary on behalf of the Board of Commissioners to receive the CSLRF funds.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Sampson, North Carolina that, pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, the following grant project ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1: This ordinance is to establish a budget for a project to be funded by the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds of H.R. 1319 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (CSLRF). The total allocation is \$12,340,152. These funds may be used for the following categories of expenditures, to the extent authorized by state law.

- 1. Support public health expenditures, by funding COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff;
- 2. Address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency, including economic harms to workers, households, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector;
- 3. Replace lost public sector revenue, using this funding to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic;
- 4. Provide premium pay for essential workers, offering additional support to those who have borne and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors; and,
- 5. Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, making necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water, support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, and to expand access to broadband internet.

Section 2: The following amounts are appropriated for the project and authorized for expenditure:

Project Description

The African American Read In Program began in 1990 as a platform to encourage more diversity in children's literature. The Sampson-Clinton Public Library System has hosted the African American Read-in Program for the past two years. Annually community members and students read excerpts, perform book adaptations, and recite poems centered on African and/or African Americans. This program extends the invitation to influential members of the community to share their favorite stories that encompasses diversity, culture, and globalization. As a result, the African American Read-In Program is one that allows students throughout to connect their experiences through the art of storytelling. Most importantly it tells the rich culture grounded in the African American experience, storytelling.

Community Impact

According to a 2019 report, published by Cooperative Children's Book Center (CCBC) School of Education in Wisconsin, diverse books are still at a low. CCBC's objective is to reflect the true demographics of our country while sharing various understandings of nationalities. CCBC began its initiative in 1985 by documenting how many books were being published by and/or included African Americans. In 2018, CCBC received 3,653 books. Unfortunately, only 405 books contained African American characters and only 202 books received were written by African Americans. Their 2019 report revealed that even though there are great books written for and by African Americans, there are not enough of them. Reading a book that demonstrates diversity reflects through children of color that their lives are valuable enough that an author would choose to write about them. In addition, it demonstrates that diversity has a role in our society to be recorded through language and shared among others ("Publishing Statistics on Children's/YA Books about People of Color and First/Native Nations and by People of Color and First/Native Nations Authors and Illustrators" 2019). Simply storytelling through literature is just another form of expression that has the power to transcend experiences globally. With this grant we can continue this endeavor by building the bridge between literature, diversity, and representation.

Intended Audience and Goals

Initially Sampson-Clinton Public Library (SCPL) focused on targeting the school system. As we continued, SCPL noticed that there was a dire need for the entire community to view and build connections with African American experiences, literature, and storytelling. With this program students can share their interpretation of literature read through the arts. These performances can

simply be reading a story aloud, reciting a poem, performing a dance, playing musical instruments, or expressing themselves through other forms of visual arts. Therefore, we intend to appeal to a general audience because our goal is to make an impact through literature and expression.

The primary goal of receiving this grant will be to provide funds to obtain a professional storyteller and/or performer. SCPL intends for the next program to be more exciting and invigorating than previous years. This year SCPL wants to obtain Bright Star Theatre Company located in North Carolina. Bright Star Theatre Company provides storytelling performances for school aged and general audiences. They are an awesome, energetic company that provides African and/or African American folklore across the world, including Anansi the Spider.

Location and Project Activities Description

Bright Star Theatre's services are quoted \$545.00 for one, one- hour performance. Many of our participants will be volunteering their services. Sampson Clinton Public Library's responsibilities include: providing the space and seating; sound system for performances; and providing the expenses for the décor. Therefore, the only cost that SCPL will need to match is the cost for Bright Star Theatre's service and promotion. This year SCPL anticipates promoting this event using our social media platforms and printing posters to display in our schools. SCPL plans displaying promotional material in surrounding schools, daycare facilities, and other public places. For this service, at Ink Spot in Clinton, an 11' x 17' flyer is \$2.99 each. We estimate that printing should cost \$200 to ensure that we have enough flyers to place in are schools and public places.

The program is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, February 10th beginning at <u>6:00pm</u>. The location is yet to be determined; SCPL is waiting to hear back from Clinton City Schools for a location. This program will invite the following pillars of our community: Sampson City and Sampson County School Districts executive administration and staff; Sampson County Government Officials; Sampson County Police and Fire Departments; local churches; and daycare centers. Performances will include a storytelling performance by Bright Star Theatre and an upcoming African American author. <u>SCPL anticipates that the program will be 6:00pm</u> - <u>8:00pm</u>. The tentative program is as follows:

- Response- Clinton City School and Sampson County School Districts Administration
- Story Teller: Bright Star Theatre
- Author Talk
- Conclusion/Comments [from Pillars of our Community]

Promotion and Evaluation

We recently received an inquiry and offer to purchase surplus real property, parcel number 16091208001, located on Garland Highway (Hwy. 701), Garland. The parcel is adjacent to 17584 Garland Highway.

This 2.6 acre rectangle shaped parcel was acquired by Sampson County through foreclosure in 2002. The amount of taxes, fees and penalties owed at the time of the foreclosure was \$1,670.30. According to the tax records the current value of the property is \$19,562.

Ms. Eddington has offered the County \$2,000.00 for this property and has made a deposit of 5% (\$100).

Attached for your information is a map, property detail and tax assessment. We respectfully request that the Board of Commissioners declare the property surplus and direct staff to accept bids on the property.

Pursuant to GS 160A-269, the Board may receive, solicit, or negotiate an offer to purchase and advertise it for upset bids. When an offer is made and the Board proposes to accept it, the Board shall require the five percent (5%) bid deposit and shall publish a notice of the offer. If within 10 days of publication of the offer, no one has raised the bid by no less than ten percent (10%) of the first thousand dollars (\$1,000) and five percent (5%) of the remainder and provided the County with a five percent (5%) bid deposit, the Board may accept the offer and sell the property to the highest bidder. If the bid is raised, the process must be repeated until no further qualifying upset bids are received, and at that time the Board may accept the offer and sell the property to the highest bidder. The Board may at any time reject any and all offers.







PUBLIC COMMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES Revised June, 2018

In accordance with NCGS 153A-52.1, a period reserved for comments from the public on topics not otherwise included on that evening's agenda will be included as an item of business on all agendas of regularly-scheduled Board of Commissioners meetings and shall be deemed the "Public Comment" segment of the agenda. The Public Comment segment of the agenda will be placed at the end of the agenda, following the conclusion of all other open session business. Because subjects of Special and Emergency Meetings are often regulated by General Statutes, there will be no Public Comments segment reserved on agendas of these meetings; however, Special and Emergency Meetings are open for public attendance.

As with public hearings, the Chair (or presiding officer) will determine and announce limits on speakers at the start of the Public Comment period. Each speaker will be allocated no more than five (5) minutes. The Chairman (or presiding officer) may, at their discretion, decrease this time allocation if the number of persons wishing to speak would unduly prolong the meeting. A staff member will be designated as official timekeeper, and the timekeeper will inform the speaker when they have one minute remaining of their allotted time. When the allotted time is exhausted, the speaker will conclude their remarks promptly and leave the lectern. Speakers may not yield their time to another speaker, and they may not sign up to speak more than once during the same Public Comment period.

An individual wishing to address the Board during the Public Comment period shall register with the Clerk/Deputy Clerk to the Board prior to the opening of the meeting by signing his or her name, and providing an address and short description of his or her topic on a sign-up sheet stationed at the entrance of the meeting room. Any related documents, printed comments, or materials the speaker wishes distributed to the Commissioners shall be delivered to the Clerk/Deputy Clerk in sufficient amounts (10 copies) at least fifteen minutes prior to the start of the meeting. Speakers will be acknowledged to speak in the order in which their names appear on the sign-up sheet. Speakers will address the Commissioners from the lectern, not from the audience, and begin their remarks by stating their name and address.

To ensure the safety of board members, staff and meeting attendees, speakers are not allowed to approach the Board on the seating platform, unless invited by the Board to approach.

Speakers who require accommodation for a disabling condition should contact the office of the County Clerk or County Manager not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting.

If time allows, those who fail to register before the meeting may be allowed speak during the Public Comment period. These individuals will be offered the opportunity to speak following those who registered in advance. At this time in the agenda, an individual should raise his or her hand and ask to be recognized by the Board Chair (or presiding officer) and then state his or her name, address and introduce the topic to be addressed.

A total of thirty (30) minutes shall be set aside for public comment. At the end of this time, those who signed up to speak but have not yet been recognized may be requested to hold their comments until the next meeting's public comment period, at which time they will be given priority for expression. Alternatively, the Board, in its discretion, may extend the time allotted for public comment.

Items of discussion during the Public Comment segment of the meeting will be only those appropriate to Open Meetings. Closed Meeting topics include, but are not limited to, such subjects as personnel, acquisition of real property, and information protected by the client-attorney privilege. Closed Meeting subjects will not be entertained. Speakers will not discuss matters regarding the candidacy of any person seeking public office, including the candidacy of the person addressing the Board.

Speakers will be courteous in their language and presentation, shall not use profanity or racial slurs and shall not engage in personal attacks that by irrelevance, duration or tone may threaten or perceive to threaten the orderly and fair progress of the discussion. Failure to abide by this requirement may result in forfeiture of the speaker's right to speak.

The Public Comments segment of the agenda is intended to provide a forum for the Board of Community to listen to citizens; there shall be no expectation that the Board will answer impromptu questions. However, Board members, through the presiding officer, may ask the speaker questions for clarification purposes. Any action on items brought up during the Public Comment period will be at the discretion of the Board. When appropriate, items will be referred to the Manager or the proper Department Head for further review.

A copy of the Public Comments Policy will be included in the agenda of each regular meeting agenda and will be made available at the speaker registration table. The policy is also available on the County's website.
