Beatty started as a detention officer working on shift. He immediately stood out as a leader among his peers and was asked to attend the armed detention officer's course. Sgt. Beatty completed the armed detention officer's course and was moved to support service as a transport officer. His willingness to learn was apparent to his supervisors and he was asked to attend Basic Law Enforcement Training. Sgt. Beatty juggled transportation and night school (BLET) not missing a beat. He completed BLET and was elevated to the lead transportation officer. Sgt Beatty was also placed as the backup to the intake / booking supervisor over support services. Sgt. Beatty dedication went far beyond his Monday thru Friday shift, as he would be there on weekends and holidays making sure everyone was in place for court the following week. Sgt. Beatty served that position for seven years, before being asked to take a school resource officer position. Sgt. Beatty did not forget where he came from and kept his certification active. After school, three days out the week you could find him working at the jail until lockdown. The intake / booking supervisor position became open, and Sgt. Beatty decided to come back to the jail with his knowledge and experience. Sgt. Beatty remains faithful in helping the night shift and on weekends. He still comes in on weekends to do transports as needed. Sgt. Beatty still does a lot of volunteer time and service with the community from escorting funerals, and benefit motorcycle rides, to providing security for church functioning's. Sgt. Beatty has been a pillar for the

Sheriff's office with his unwavering dedication. He is a leader that leads by example, and his dedication to training speaks for itself. Intermediate Service Award, Supervisor Leadership Course, CIT, Field Training Officer, School Resource Officer, Advance School Resource Training, WRAP Instructor, ALICE Instructor, Radar Certification, and EMS (FEMA Training) these are just a few. The Sampson County Board of Commissioners convened for their regular meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, September 9, 2024, in the County Auditorium, 435 Rowan Road in Clinton, North Carolina. Members present: Chairman Jerol Kivett, Vice Chairperson Sue Lee, and Commissioners Thaddeus Godwin, Lethia Lee and Allen McLamb.

Chairman Jerol Kivett called the meeting to order and turned the meeting over to Vice Chairperson Sue Lee who provided the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Upon a motion by Commissioner Godwin and seconded by Vice Chairperson Sue Lee, the Board voted unanimously to approve the agenda with the following amendments:

- Added Item 2(e): Emergency Management Presentation by Rick Sauer
- Added a Memorandum of Understanding between the Sampson County Child
 Advocacy Center and the Sampson County Health Department to the Consent Agenda

Item 1: Swearing In of County Attorney

Chairman Kivett called upon County Attorney Paul Allen and acknowledged his family. Clerk to the Board Stephanie Shannon administered Mr. Allen's Oath of Office.

Item 2: Presentations and Updates

Fort Liberty Regional Land Use Advisory Commission Recognition Chairman Kivett called upon Mr. Roland Hall who has served faithfully on the Fort Liberty RLUAC since 2012. Upon his retirement, the RLUAC presented Mr. Hall with the Distinguished Service Award. Chairman Kivett expressed the County's appreciation for Mr. Hall's service.

<u>Citizen Recognition</u> Chairman Kivett called upon Commissioner Lethia Lee who acknowledged Tyler Wise. Ms. Wise serves as the Lead for NC Fellow for the Town of Roseboro. Commissioner Lee presented Ms. Wise with a certificate of appreciation and thanked her for her contributions to the Town of Roseboro and Sampson County as a whole. Ms. Wise and Mayor Alice Butler then spoke briefly about her work with the Town of Roseboro.

Animal Shelter Update Chairman Kivett called upon Animal Shelter Director Anna Ellis who provided an update on the Animal Shelter renovations and operations. Ms. Ellis discussed the advantages of having a veterinarian and surgical suite on site. Ms. Ellis also proposed that adoption fees be reduced four times per year when the shelter becomes full and that the County offer a rabies vaccination clinic for the citizens of Sampson County once per quarter at a cost of \$10 per vaccine. Upon a motion by Chairman Kivett and Vice Chairperson Sue Lee, the Board voted unanimously to approve these proposed changes.

<u>Ivanhoe Water Project Status Update</u> Chairman Kivett called upon Public Works Director Mark Turlington and Engineer David Ross who provided an update on the Ivanhoe Water Project. Mr. Ross reviewed the map of proposed water lines and informed the Board that the project has been advertised for bids. Public Works will hold a pre-bid conference on September 16 prior to the bid opening on October 3. Mr. Ross stated that he hopes to have a recommendation of award at the October 7, 2024 Board meeting.

Emergency Services Presentation Chairman Kivett called upon Emergency Services Director Rick Sauer who reviewed two recent 911 calls and the dispatch errors that were made. Mr. Sauer also discussed staffing issues at the 911 Center and presented a detailed improvement plan that he intends to implement immediately. Overall, the issues of staffing, infrastructure, and funding need to be addressed by Emergency Services leadership as well as the Board of Commissioners. Chairman Kivett provided remarks on a recent visit to the 911 center and commended staff for their hard work despite the department being understaffed and lacking necessary funding.

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Item 4: County Manager's Report

Chairman Kivett called upon County Manager Ed Causey who introduced new Inspections Director Devin Hall. The Board welcomed Mr. Hall and shared that they had already heard positive comments from constituents about the work that he is doing in his new role.

Item 5: Public Comment Period

Chairman Kivett opened the floor for public comments. The following were received:

Steve Lamb – "I appreciate seeing you all Board members and whatever. I've got a very, very bad complaint over the food inspection system of Ms. Wanda Robinson. The way it's been handled she's going to one place, Sharon's. Had it closed down but all the other places, when people tries to get something done, she's refused and I've called several other places about it and I've called the human resources issue about it. It's unreal. She closed one restaurant down and then will go to the other restaurants by the North Carolina state law they're supposed to have hair nets wearing hair nets, beard nets, gloves and other than other things but it needs, she needs, somebody needs to have something done to the way her and her people are running the show over there because if you're going to go to one place business it's just like other inspections. You don't play. You don't go to one inspection and close your eyes because you've got a friend. If you've got a state job you're supposed to do your job. Thank you."

Anthony Monds – "Good evening. Y'all miss me? Been three months, but I've been following you on the YouTube channel due to some personal issues. That's why I wasn't here but I'm glad to be here. Good to see y'all. Okay, let's get started. My issue of many that I have, but I'm going to address one is we going to define character. Character is the mental or moral quality distinctive to an individual. Now, with that being said, I've had to address the character flaws with the Board and you all know what I've been battling and I've seen that the human resources has addressed some ethical policy issues with your DSS department, something that should have been addressed a long time ago and being that it is being addressed right now...if one's heart doesn't change, you can change all the laws and ethics and put whatever you want to in writing, but if the character of the individual from the head down doesn't change, you get the same stuff. One of the mothers of my church said that an eagle never flew so high that his stuff didn't hit the ground. You know what that stuff is. So, eventually, the stuff is going to be exposed. I said that when I first started coming here and it starts at the head, and it works its way down. Now, I've spoke with each commissioner except for one and you know who you are, the one I have not spoke with individually and it's funny that one just said earlier that he loves hearing from his constituents but when his constituents bring issues to you that you negate them and you turn deaf ear to them and then when the constituent continually brings the issue to you, you, now we see what your character is. Now we see what your mental and your moral distinct quality is for you as an individual and this is what I would like to point out because going forward, we elected y'all. If we elected y'all, y'all work for us. Now, we're not looking for perfection, but we are looking for is accountability. What we are looking for is if you get it wrong own it. And we see what's been happening here the last few months even

with the million dollar type thing and you know if you get it wrong own it. One thing I can say about my commissioner, he is not perfect. I can tell you that. He and I do bump heads. He and I do disagree on some things, but if he miss it he owns it, and that's something that each one of you should take to heart including the new atty here. But, if you miss it, you own it. Therefore, you get respect. But if you don't own it now I have to question your character because of what you said you would do and now you choose not to do it. So, and don't be a puppet. If you're going to represent your constituents, do what you say you was going to do. Don't back away from it. Y'all have a blessed night."

Joshua Harrell - "Good evening. My name is Johsua Harrell and I live at 312 Maple Street, Roseboro, NC. I am here today to talk about EMS response times and policy changes that need to be made. My mother, Carla Small, had a cardiac arrest on June 15, 2024 at my home in Roseboro and went unconscious while on the phone with the operator. Due to the current policies in place, the fire department was not dispatched immediately with EMS and she went without oxygen for more than ten minutes. While nothing may have changed the outcome that evening, if Roseboro fire was dispatched immediately alongside EMS, there is a possibility that life-saving aid could have been provided to her sooner. I am sure there are others in the county who have experienced similar delays in response times as well. It is my understanding that fire is not automatically dispatched with EMS, however, that multiple fire departments have requested this policy be changed. Many other counties and states have opposite policies where the fire department is dispatched immediately, alongside EMS regardless of the type of call in order to provide continuous care. The International Association of Fire Chiefs has recommended the use of fire-based EMS since 1975, which means our county is far behind schedule on this issue. The fire department may not be able to provide advanced medical care, however they could provide oxygen and administer CPR if needed prior to the arrival of EMS. A simple change in policy can fix this and I'm calling on this policy to be updated immediately. The County Commissioners should consider putting together a committee of public safety professionals and members of the public in order to address this issue and others that may arise. Let me be clear, this is not an attack on our first responders. They do an amazing job. It is about removing red tape so that they can save lives. Thank you."

Andrea Rouse - "Good evening. Andrea Rouse. Roseboro, NC. Snow Hill Community. Another familiar face. It's not often I guess I can come up here and say a whole lot positive, but today I will. Mr. Causey, great selection in Devin. Known him since he was born, graduated with his mother, work with his wife in Sampson County Schools. Upstanding young man, for people who don't know him. The young lady in Roseboro, is she still here? Well, I knew there was a lot of things going on in Roseboro, but I didn't know who to give credit to for that. She's doing a great job. If none of y'all have been through the Roseboro community, we're coming up. We're coming up in the city of Roseboro. So, let me get to my business, the landfill. As we all know, probably seen on the news that there has been something going on and that there's been a plan for some things to go on with a settlement with EJCAN and GFL to help the quality of life in Snow Hill. That's how I look at it. To help the quality of life in Snow Hill. But, I'm going to stand by what I've always said. The landfill has been here 50 years. It's run its course, and we want it closed. It's time to take it down. And I thank EJCAN, I think those people have done what they've done but the County has received benefits from that landfill that Snow Hill has never gotten any of. We've never heard anything. And I like what Commissioner McLamb said. The lines of communication are so important. The character that Reverend Monds talked about. To know that people care about us in the community. These meetings are nice. I come

and I hear some great things that I didn't know like the young lady from Roseboro. I didn't know that Devin had the position that he has now. These are great things. EMS I know they do great things. Everybody makes mistakes. We make mistakes in the school system. You guys make mistakes, but a line of communication to say, 'we care for you', outside of that chair. Continue to do what you're doing, but let's do it a little bit better. Let's talk to the community, okay? Let's get a better connection, alright?"

David Brown - "Good evening. My name is David Brown. I live at 3030 Fleet Cooper Road in Roseboro, NC. I probably have in line with the two previous speakers with me right here. I'm going to begin with a quote and an old saying. The quote was from Admiral Yamamoto. He was the architect of the Pearl Harbor raid. The one responsible. The Japanese were celebrating but he wrote in his diary, 'I fear the only thing that we have done is awaken a terrible, sleeping giant.' Your sleeping giant are the citizens and the taxpayers. We're awake now and we're going to take a real hard look at a lot of things. My particular emphasis happens to be money. I'm retired so I can't work overtime and make more money. Okay? The second one is my perception is my reality until you do something to change it. I could be wrong. Perceptions, I get information in and I formulate a thought, and I have a perception. One of my perceptions is that you're wasting money on a terrible level. I talked briefly when you mailed all the letters out about the convenience site fee. I found out there's 30,500 taxpayers for Sampson County. I'm really surprised at that number. I honestly thought it would be more than that with our population. But, you round the numbers up, at 57¢ a letter at the bulk mail rate, \$17,000 to mail those letters out saying I've got to pay a fee. And then you had to send another letter out rescinding that. That's another \$17,000. That's \$34,000. That's an average salary for a person in Sampson County for a whole year that you just took and threw it away. That doesn't count the letters and the checks that you had to send out there also. Only thing I'm going to say about the lawsuit settlement, you spent \$28 of taxpayer dollars for every \$1 that you saved in that lawsuit. I'm glad that you are not my financial advisors, okay? I found out about, I heard a comment about the million dollars. I'm not going to say a lot about that. What I read in the article was apparently a clerk made an error because of an interpretation for wording. If that's not correct then please correct me. I don't want to put wrong words out. My question is who's in charge of writing that wording? Why did you write that wording? Did you not know that it wasn't clear enough? Did the clerk who read that...did she misinterpret that? You know, now we're back to these effective lines of communication and also about our perception. Somebody's accountable, and you need to hold people accountable."

Steve Lamb began speaking from the audience: "Back to the Snow Hill deal. That not only goes to Snow Hill, it goes on Five Bridge Road and you can be sitting at Coharie Country Club in a golf cart and you can smell it down there. It just don't go to Snow Hill. It's more than Snow Hill. It goes to Peavine Road. It goes to Five Bridge Road. More areas than just Snow Hill. Thank you."

Clerk to the Board Stephanie Shannon then read the following public comment that was received via email into the record:

"In a perfect world, individuals would not have to fight hard for others to see and do the right thing. In a perfect world, individuals would see the needs of others and do what they can to assist. However, we do not live in a perfect world, nor are we perfect people. However, we should have people who assume responsibility for doing what is right and just-just for all. We still need assistance obtaining county water. We started with this

request in March 2022, and as of today, September 9, 2024, it is still before you. I have included pictures for your viewing. These past weeks have been hectic. I have had to call out plumbers, a well contractor, you name it--all because of water problems. I would be in attendance this evening; however, I cannot do so because of this water problem. We would be very appreciative if you, Public Works Director Turlington, our Board representative, or someone else could take a few minutes out of your busy schedule to communicate with us and find a resolution for us. I am reminded of the oaths taken by each of you to faithfully, impartially, and justly perform duties for the County of Sampson and its residents. We, on Old Warsaw Road, are Sampson County residents. We earnestly need your help. County water is not a luxury for us; it is a necessity. We are asking you to visualize this being you or someone you love in this situation. How would you handle this matter? In a perfect world, you would be taking initiative rather than seemingly being inactive. Thank you for your time. Humbly submitted, Elaine F. Hunt."

Any individual who willfully makes and subscribes an abstract listing required by the Subchapter (of the Revenue Laws) which he does not believe to be true and correct as to every material matter shall be guilty of a Class 2 Misdemeanor. (Punishable by Imprisonment of up to 60 days).

INSTRUCTIONS-Listings due by January 31.

Commonly Asked Questions

Who must file a listing, and what do I list?

Any Individual(s) or business(es) owning or possessing personal property used or connected with a business or other income producing purpose on January 1. Temporary absence of personal property from the place at which it is normally taxable shall not affect this rule. For example, a lawn tractor used for personal use, to mow the lawn at your home is not listed. However, a lawn tractor used as part of a landscaping business in this county must be listed if the lawn tractor is normally in this county, even if it happens to be in another state or county on January 1.

NCGS §105-308 reads ..."any person whose duty it is to list any property who willfully falls or refuses to list the same within the time prescribed by law shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor. The fallure to list shall be prima facle evidence that the failure was willful." A Class 2 Misdemeanor is punishable by imprisonment of up to 60 days.

When and where to list?

Listings are due on or before January 31. They must be filed with the County Tax Department DO NOT FILE THIS FORM WITH THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE. This form will not be accepted by the NC Department of Revenue.

A list of county tax office addresses can be found at the NC Department of Revenue's Websita. http://www.dor.state.nc.us/publications/property.html.

As required by state law, late listings will receive a penalty. An extension of time to fist may be obtained by sending a written request showing "good cause" to the County Assessor by January 31.

How do I list? -Three important rules:

(1) Rend these INSTRUCTIONS for each schedule or group.

(2) If a Schedule or Group does not apply to you, Indicate so on the listing form, <u>DO NOT LEAVE A SECTION BLANK, <u>DO NOT WRITE</u> "SAME AS LAST YEAR". A listing form may be rejected for these reasons and could result in tate listing penalties.

(3) Listings must be filed based on the tax district where the property is physically located. If you</u>

have received multiple listing forms, each form must be completed separately.

INFORMATION SECTION

Complete all sections at the top of the form, whether or not they are specifically addressed in these INSTRUCTIONS. Attach additional sheets if necessary.

- (1) Other N.C. Counties where personal property is located: If your business has property
- normally located in other counties, ilst those counties here.

 (2) Contact person for audit: In case the county tax department needs additional information, or to verify the information listed, list the person to be contacted here.
- (3) Physical address: Please note here the location of the property. The actual physical location may be different from the mailing address. Post Office Boxes are not acceptable.
 (4) Principal Business in this County: What does the listed business do? For example:

- Tobacco Farmer, Manufacture electrical appliances, Laundromat, Restaurant.

 (6) Complete other requested business information. Make any address changes.

 (8) If out of business: If the business we have sent this form to has closed, complete this section and attach any additional information regarding the sale of the property.

The year acquired column: The rows which begin "2023" are the rows in which you report property acquired during the calendar year 2023. Other years follow the same format.

Schedule A is divided into seven (7) groups. Each is addressed below. Some counties may have the column 'Prior Years Cost' pre-printed. This column should contein the cost information from last year's listing. If it does not please complete this column, referring back to your last year's listing. List under "Current Year's Cost" the 100% cost of all depreciable personal property in your possession on January 1. Include all fully depreciated assets as well. Round amounts to the nearest dollar. Use the "Additions" and Tolektions column to explain changes from "Prior Yr. Cost" to "Gurrent Yr. Cost". The "Prior Year's Cost" plus "Additions" minus "Deletions" should equal "Current Year's Cost". If there are any additions and/or deletions, please note those under schedule G, Acquisitions and Disposals Detail. If the deletion is a transferred or peld out lease, please note this, and to whom the property was transferred.

COST - Note that the cost information you provide must include all costs associated with the acquisition as well as the costs strockined with bringing that property into operation. These costs may include, but are not limited to invoice cost, trade-in allowances, freight, installation costs, sales tax, expensed costs, and construction period interest.

The cost figures reported should be historical cost, that is the original cost of an Item when first purchased, even if it was first purchased by someone other than the current owner. For example, you, the current owner, may have purchased equipment in 2000 for \$100, but the individual you purchased the equipment from acquired the equipment in 1995 for \$1000. You, the current owner, should report the property as acquired in 1995 for \$1000.

Property should be reported at its actual cost at the retail level of trade. For example, a available to any retail customer for \$2000. If the manufacturer uses the model for should report the computers can make a certain model for \$1000 total cost. It is typically available to any retail customer for \$2000. If the manufacturer uses the model for business purposes, he should report the computer at it's market cost at the rotail level of trade, which is \$2000, not the \$1000 it actually cost the manufacturer. Manufacturer/lessor businesses which lease the equipment that they manufacture must list their equipment at the retail level of trade rather-than their manufacturing cost.

Group (1) MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT

This is the group used for reporting the cost of all machinery and equipment. This includes all warehouse and packaging equipment, as well as manufacturing equipment, production lines, hi-tech or low-tech. List the total cost by year of acquisition, including fully depreciated assets that are still connected with the business.

For example, a manufacturer of textiles purchased a knifting machine in October 2023 for \$10,000. The sales tax was \$200, shipping charges were \$200, and installation costs were \$200. The total cost that the manufacturer should report is \$10,600, if there were no other costs incurred. The \$10,600 should be added in group (1) to the 2023 current year's cost column as an addition.

Group (2) Construction in Progress (CIP)

CIP is business personal property which is under construction on January 1. The accountant will typically not capitalize the assets under construction until all of the costs associated with the asset are known. In the latenin period, the accountant will typically maintain the costs of the asset in a CIP account. The total of this account represents investment in tangible personal property, and is to be listed with the other capital assets of the business during the listing period. List in detail. If you have no CIP, write "none".

Group (3) Office Furniture & Fixtures

This group is for reporting the costs of all furniture & fixtures and small office machines used in the business operation. This includes, but is not limited to, file cabinets, desks, chairs, adding machines, curtains, blinds, ceiling fans, window air conditioners, telephones, intercom systems, and burglar atarm systems.

Group (4) Computer Equipment

This group is for reporting the costs of non-production computers & peripherals. This includes, but is not limited to, personal computers, midrange, or mainframes, as well as the monitors, printers, scanners, magnetic storage devices, cables, & other peripherals associated with those computers. This category also includes software that is capitalized and purchased from an unrelated business entity. Note: The development cost of software or any modification cost to software, whether done internally by the taxpayer or externally by a third party to meet the customer's specified needs is excluded and should not be reported. This does not include high tech equipment such as proprietary computerized point of sale equipment or high tech medical equipment, or computer controlled equipment, or the high-tech computer components that control the equipment. This type of equipment would be included in Group (1) or "other".

Group (5) Leasehold Improvements

This group includes real estate improvements to leased property contracted for, installed, and paid for by the lossee which may remain with the real estate, thereby becoming an integral part of the leased fee real estate upon expiration or termination of the current lease, but which are the property of the current lessee who installed it. (Examples are have no leasehold improvements write "none". Contact the appropriate county to determine if you question if leasehold improvements have already been appraised as real property.

Group (6) Expensed Items

This group is for reporting any assets which would typically be capitalized, but due to the business' capitalization threshold, they have been expensed. Section 179 expensed items should be included in the appropriate group (1) through (4). Fill in the blank which asks for your business' "Capitalization Threshold." If you have no expensed items write "none".

Group (7) Supplies

Almost all businesses have supplies. These include normal business operating supplies. List the cost on hand as of January 1. Remember, the temporary absence of properly on January 1 does not mean it should not be listed if that property is normally present. 



Dangerous Dog Appeal Hearing

 Call to Order: Dr. Jeffrey Bell called Hearing to order. The dog in question is Princess, owned by Oscar Williams.

II. Dangerous Dog Hearing

a) Overview of Dangerous Dog Hearing Process: Dr. Jeffrey Bell reviewed Article 1A. Dangerous Dogs Sections (a) (1) a. and b; (2) a. b. and c. (See attached). Dr. Jeffrey Bell stated that all speakers will have three minutes to speak, speakers will then be asked questions by the Committee. He explained that it is important to stay on topic and give facts of exactly what happened and what was witnessed during the events that occurred on April 18, 2024.

b) Public Comment:

Dr. Jeffrey Bell called Oscar Williams to speak. He was sworn in under Oath by Wanda Robinson.

c) Discussion:

Mr. Oscar Williams: "Good evening, everyone. The first objection I have, the very first one, is Princess was in her yard. What's mine is my dogs. I do have signs up in my yard - "Beware of Dog", "No Trespassing", and one more, I can't think of right now. I think my main thing is, she was home. It's her premises. I just call it one of those things where she was trying to protect her premises. She has not been in any trouble before. That's basically, I'm not going to sit here and try to prolong this thing and say a lot of words, but that's what I got to say in defense of Princess, she's a good girl. I hate that it happened, Lord knows I hate it. I wouldn't want that to happen, not even to another dog. If there is any way I could reverse this thing, I would. She was home and she did what other dogs would do, protect the premises. In the camera, she was coming from the back yard and when he pulled up in the yard. I know this guy, he lives right down the street, friends, no animosity between us. Well, prior to this, there wasn't. He got out of the car, right in front of my house, and that's when she was coming from the back yard and barking. He got out and walked around the front of his car and up the steps. They were walking up meeting one another and met each other. Before there was any bite that took place they were as close as the length of this table, but he just kept walking up to my house, she was coming like walking towards him. He turned around, I don't know if it was his wife in the

car. She was blowing the horn, laying on the horn to get him back in the car. That's what got my wife's attention, the horn. His wife kept going get in the car, get in the car and he kept right on walking. When he turned, he stumbled and fell. When he fell things took place. Princess was protecting her domain. She didn't just run and jump on him or anything. That's just the way I see it.

Dr. Jeffrey Bell asked the Committee if they had questions.

<u>Joel Starling-County Attorney</u> asked Mr. Williams how he knew what happened during the incident if he was not there, as stated in the report. Mr. Williams explained he has a ring doorbell camera. Joel asked if the footage was available, Mr. Williams stated he could pull it up on his wife's cell phone, that he brought with him.

<u>Dr. Jeffrey Bell</u> explained that the committee must go by the law. He explained that the dog was unprovoked as no one was tormenting the dog. He was walking toward the front of your property up to the front door, not sneaking around the back.

Mr. Oscar Williams: "That is a form of being provoked, just coming on the property. He came onto the property with the signs out. We aren't talking about a person versus a person. We are talking about a person versus a dog. That's provoking right there, he continued to come with the dog barking. I could see if the dog was running and jumping, but she was barking and that's a sign. Seems like all the blame shouldn't be put on Princess. I am not the smartest person; I am just a normal guy and I just try to use some common knowledge. With the dog barking, he should have taken that sign that he may be in danger. The dog can't speak for herself; I have to speak for her. I do not agree with that, I believe provoke can have a two-fold meaning. She didn't dive on him and started doing that. You can hear the wife blowing the horn and hollering for him to get in the car, but he kept walking and that's provoking."

Wanda Robinson, Health Director asked why Mr. Melton was there. Williams-I have not talked to them. They are my friends of mine. He used to live next door with his parents. I still visit his parents, an elderly couple. I got his number, I've called, but they haven't returned my calls. I guess I understand that, and I don't hold anything against them. The information I received from the Sheriff's Department enlighten me on some things, but I have not talked to BJ. I have left messages and anything I can do let me know. I'm willing to pay doctor bills, whatever, just because she's mine. She's like my child and I would do anything for my child. I have offered myself to him.

<u>Russell Devane</u> asked Mr. Williams if he could explain why the committee is dealing with the same issue and same owner, once again.

Mr. Oscar Williams: "Sir, things happen more than once in your life, and in my life and in everyone else's lives. It's just one of those things that happened. Not the same dog. That's the best I can give you. We all stumble, we all fall. We do not get it right all the time, we get it wrong more than one time, we get it wrong more than two times. You, me, and everyone else.

<u>Russell Devane</u> explained that once a mistake is made, we should ensure that it does not happen again.

<u>Dr. Jeffrey Bell</u> asked Mr. Oscar Williams to work on pulling up the ring doorbell footage for the committee to view.

Sgt. Jessica Kittrell explained the purpose of the declaration in this incident was that Princess was in an attack that resulted in multiple injuries requiring Mr. Melton to be rushed emergently to Cape Fear Valley. It was an unprovoked incident that resulted in severe injuries that required hospitalization. Mr. Melton had extensive injuries with several bites and lacerations. He also had a scalp laceration that was a result of him falling on the porch prior to the attack, not Princess. She explained that approaching a residence in a not threatening manner would not fall under a provoked bite. She informed the committee that Braveheart, an already declared dog, was also part of this incident. She explained that Mr. Melton witnessed a gentleman picking up trash on the side of the road, that was yelling for help and noticed the dogs were near him. The purpose of Mr. Melton approaching the home was to notify them that their dogs were out and causing an issue. Mr. Melton made it to the doorstep before the incident occurred.

Mr. Adam Phillips (Attorney representing Mr. Melton) explained that it was his understanding that Mr. Melton and his wife were in the area trying to assist someone in need of help. Mr. Melton was trying to engage the dog back to the house. Mr. Phillips stated that he was unaware that Mr. Melton had familiarity with the house, and they were friends, as stated by Mr. Williams earlier. Mr. Phillips stated that Mr. Melton fell, and that is when he was attacked, which clearly makes it unprovoked. Mr. Melton was sent to Cape Fear, then airlifted to UNC Hillsborough. He was discharged with a stent in his eye and walking with a cane. The healing time is unknown. Mr. Phillips passed around photos of Mr. Melton's injuries to the committee. He stated that Mr. Melton is retired.

At this time Mr. Oscar Williams shared the doorbell video with the Committee. Mr. Williams stated that when he left the dogs were in the fence and he thought the gate was locked. He assumed he did not properly lock the gate and did not believe they jumped or escaped the fence. Normally his dogs are inside, as they are inside dogs.

No further discussion.

Dr. Jeffrey Bell requested that the Board vote if no other questions or discussion. He asked for a show of hands of all members that vote to uphold Sgt. Kittrell's determination that Princess is a Dangerous Dog. Six committee members raised their hand to uphold, zero opposed.

Determination that Princess is a Dangerous Dog; Upheld.

Dr. Jeffrey Bell explained this determination. Joel explained that once the written decision is received, Mr. Williams can appeal against that through superior court, if desired.

III. Adjournment: Dangerous Dog Appeal Hearing adjourned by Dr. Jeffrey Bell.

- V. Approval of minutes
 - a) March 18, 2024- SCHD Health Advisory Committee meeting minutes: Motion to approve made by Commissioner Lethia Lee, 2nd by Russell Devane. All in favor.
- VI. Environmental Health Update- Kory Hair: Kory reviewed the PFAS handout. See attached. Information will be provided on the website. Committee reviewed an example of the letter citizens are getting from PFAS testing. Kory explained that the state took this upon themselves to perform the testing through the company DEQ. Unfortunately, Environmental Health does not pull and test water samples due to the testing restrictions on certain chemicals with State Lab. Although DEQ sends the results to the landowner and the Health Department, the landowner should call the number on their results page, not the Health Department or Environmental Health. The landfill was thought to have caused most positive PFAS tests, yet this has shown to not be the case. Kory stated that some of the tested wells around the landfill were negative and that some of the positives are not near the landfill, they were in other parts of the County.
- VII. Child Fatality Committee Member Appointments: Wanda Robinson stated that there are two members that need to be added to the CFPT roster:

- a) Sgt. Kevin Pearson: Motion to approve as a "State Highway Patrol" member made by Russel Davane; 2nd by Lethia Lee. All in favor.
- b) Sarah Rosario: Motion to approve as a member who "lost a child prior to the age of 18" made by Russell Devane; 2nd by Lethia Lee. All in favor.

VIII. Policy Updates

- a) HIPAA Policy: Changes reviewed by Cherish Allen. Motion to approve the 2024 HIPAA Policy with changes made by Yire Hernandez; 2nd by Russell Devane. All in favor.
- b) FISCAL Policy: Changes reviewed by Tamra Jones. Motion to approve the 2024 FISCAL Services Policy with changes made by Yire Hernandez; 2nd by Russell Devane. All in favor.

- IX. COVID Update- No new update. COVID tests are still available in the Kiosk located at the front door of the Health Department.
- X. Maternal Health Update: Unfortunately, the Health Department is losing Dr. Ferrell. Currently there are 83 clients in this clinic; 50% are high risk, 42 clients are uninsured. Kelly Stated that 27 clients out of the 42 uninsured are high risk. Wanda Robinson stated that the hospital is going to work with the Health Department to ensure that maternal health clients continue to be seen.
- XI. Financial-Monthly Update: Tamra reviewed monthly report. No questions.
- XII. Health Directors Report: Wanda Robinson asked the Committee how they felt about going back to having the meetings at Ribeyes, as they did pre-COVID. The Committee agreed to continue to have the meetings at the Health Department.
- XIII. Public Comment: Veronica Stevens from Changing paths. Changing Paths is a new recovery center that is opening in Clinton. It will open in three phases. Currently the clinic is open. The second phase will be an inpatient center with fifty-six beds. This space is for individuals that may be going through detox. There will also be four beds for acute situations. The third phase will be the apartments. Individuals can come in for detoxing or acute care, once they have detoxed, they can move to the apartments to finish their treatment. This will allow them to live a "likenormal" lifestyle while still receiving treatment and care. The clinic will be an outpatient care and will provide treatment to help clients that would like to transition into recovery. Changing Paths will include Counselors, group therapy, AA meetings, and NA meetings. Quite a few community members are participating. Changing Paths will also see and treat pregnant women

needing these services. Ms. Stevens invited everyone to come and take a tour. She stated that there is not a facility not quite like this in Sampson County or surrounding counties. Katrina Boykin stated that she has been and toured this facility, and it is very inviting. Commissioner Lethia Lee stated that this has been her dream for Sampson County to have a center like this.
