Qualifications & Appointments

- Must be a registered voter
- Must be a resident of the county in which the precinct is located
- Must not be an elected government official or a manager or treasurer for any candidate or political party.

Precinct Officials can be recommended by the political parties. Ultimately, Precinct Officials are appointed by Sampson County Board of Elections for a **two-year term** beginning in August of odd-numbered years.

Available Positions

- CHIEF JUDGES are the head official in charge of Election Day activities at the voting sites, as well as, picking up and returning Election Day supplies at the Board of Elections Office.
- JUDGES work closely with the Chief Judge and are responsible for conducting the election in the Chief Judge's absence. They must sign all official documents and serve on a panel to resolve any challenges.
- ASSISTANTS serve when needed and at the discretion and direction of the Chief Judge.
- RESERVE ASSISTANTS are available to go to any precinct and work on election day <u>if needed</u>.
- ONE-STOP WORKERS work during the two weeks prior to an election when early voting is being conducted.

Training

All officials <u>are required</u> to attend training sessions conducted by the Board of Elections prior to each major primary and general election. With Covid-19, most training will be online and can be found on the Board of Elections website (http://www.sampsonnc.com/departments/boe/index.php) and on YouTube. Specific jobs, such as the check-in station, provisional ballots, and others, will require in-person training and necessary Covid-19 protocols will be followed. Chief Judges will notify which election assistants are to get inperson training for their assigned jobs.

Set-Up

Set up before the polls for one-stop or election day <u>will be</u> <u>required</u>. This is an important time to meet your team and figure out the flow of the next day. Compensation is provided. The Board of Elections Office must be notified 48 hours before if you cannot make set up and no set up compensation will be received.

Election Day Checklist

- Wear comfortable clothing and dress in layers to account for varying temperatures
- Do not wear party colors as a election worker
- Leave your campaign buttons and political jewelry at home
- Discussion of politics is not permitted while working at the polls
- Arrange for enough food and drinks for the entire day
- Smoking is not permitted in the voting enclosure and all building rules should be followed.

NOTICE TO APPLICANT - PLEASE READ BEFORE YOU SIGN BELOW

Persons appointed to these positions must be registered voters and residents of the county in which the precinct is located, of good repute, and able to read and write. Not more then one judge in each precinct shall belong to the same political party as the Chief Judge. No person shall be eligible who holds any elective office under the government of the United States or of the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision thereof. No person shall be eligible to serve as a precinct official who is a candidate for nomination or election. No person shall be eligible to serve as a precinct official who holds any office in a state, congressional district, county or precinct political party or political organization, or who is a manager or treasurer for any candidate or political party, provided however that the position of delegate to a political party convention shall not be considered an office for the purpose of this subsection. The following categories of relatives are prohibited from serving as precinct officials of the same precinct: spouse, child, spouse of child, sister or brother. No precinct official who is the wife, husband, mother, father, son, daughter, brother or sister of any candidate for nomination or election may service as a precinct official during any primary or election in which such candidate participates. The Board of Elections may remove you as a precinct official for misbehavior or neglect of duty.
