The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice, in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth **for the state fiscal year 2022-2023** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2022**. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Interpersonal Skill Building: Facilitation groups to include, at a minimum, social skills, conflict resolution, decision making and communication skills.

Conflict Resolution: School-based mediation services to address and resolve interpersonal conflict with referred youth from Middle Schools/Roseboro-Salemburg Middle School.

Mentoring: Provides opportunities for adult volunteers to be matched with delinquent or at-risk youth in Sampson County Schools on a one-on-one basis

Psychological Services: Conducts assessment services to provide diagnosis and treatment intervention recommendations for youth.

Sexual Offender Treatment: Provides outpatient assessment and/or therapeutic services to juvenile offenders targeting inappropriate sexual conduct and offending behavior with clear focus on rehabilitation and accountability of the offender.

Vocational Skills: Pre-employment preparation, career exploration and readiness, including work experience.

Restitution/Community Service: Providing youth an opportunity to be accountable for their actions by completing community service in their community, and/or paying restitution to victims of their crimes.

Teen Court: Diverts juvenile cases, for certain offenses for a hearing by a jury of the juvenile's peers, which may assign the juvenile to counseling, restitution, curfews, community service, or other rehabilitative services.

Temporary Shelter Services: Residential Services that provide group home care and shelter, up to 90 days, for juveniles temporarily removed from their home during family crisis.

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth with prior referrals and adjudications, school behavior problems, substance abuse concerns, negative peer relationships and gang association/involvement.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Delinquent peer associations and gang association/involvement

Individual Domain: Substance abuse concerns

Family Domain: Family criminal history

School Domain: School behavior problems

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individual, if applicable.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.

All applications must be submitted in NCALLIES by the deadline below to be considered for funding. **All prospective applicants are required to complete New Applicant Training for proposal to be considered.**
